A preliminary assessment of the biopsychosocial model was conducted using the Medline database, using the term 'biopsychosocial' in the topics field. It is well recognised that use of the term 'biopsychosocial' does not necessarily indicate an adoption of the biopsychosocial model, but at a minimum, it does reflect a recognition of the perspective (Suls & Rothman, 2004).

One of the most comprehensive approaches to conceptualizing mental health assessment and treatment is the biopsychosocial (BPS) approach, originally proposed by Engel in 1977. This approach takes a comprehensive, systemic perspective to integrating the psychological, biological, and sociocultural influences on human development and functioning (Suchman, 2005).
