Triage is one key strategy used to ensure that all patients who present to an emergency care setting receive access to care in an organised, equitable and timely manner. Triage is the process of sorting patients as they present to the emergency care setting.

Emergency Triage and Rapid Assessment

Emergency Triage, Treat, and Transport (ET3) is a voluntary, five-year payment model that will provide greater flexibility to ambulance care teams to address emergency health care needs of Medicare Fee-for-Service (FFS) beneficiaries following a 911 call. CMS will continue to pay to transport a Medicare FFS beneficiary to a hospital emergency department or other covered destination.

Five-level triage instruments are the gold standard in emergency medicine. The Australasian Triage Scale, the Canadian Triage and Acuity Scale, the Manchester Triage System, and the Emergency Severity Index are all validated instruments and are the most widely used systems.

Modern Triage in the Emergency Department

Triage originates from the French word "trier," which is used to describe the processes of sorting and organization. Triage is utilized in the healthcare community to categorize patients based on the severity of their injuries and, by extension, the order in which multiple patients require care and monitoring. The history of the emergency triage originated in the military for field doctors.
