Homelessness in America. Seventeen out of every 10,000 people in the United States were experiencing homelessness on a single night in January 2019 during HUD's Annual Point-in-Time Count.. These 567,715 people represent a cross-section of America. They are associated with every region of the country, family status, gender category, and racial/ethnic group.

We've seen this issue arise in some form since the 1870s and it's continued to pervade our society into the present day.
