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The federal government, under U.S. Code Title 20, Chapter 33, ensures rights to disabled students and their families through a law called the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This act is the crux of special ed law, because it governs how states and public agencies provide early intervention, special education, and related services to children with disabilities.
