The young Blake was ultimately apprenticed for 50 guineas to James Basire (1730-1802), a highly responsible and conservative line engraver who specialized in prints depicting architecture. For seven years (1772-79) Blake lived with Basire’s family on Great Queen Street, near Lincoln’s Inn Fields, London.
